DIRECTOR'S NOTES

It gives me great pleasure to welcome you all to our production of *The Vicar of Dibley*. Based on the much-loved television situation comedy from the 1990s, I am sure that this stage version of the show (specially adapted for amateur theatre companies to perform by Ian Gower and Paul Carpenter) needs very little introduction from me. It is one of the most successful TV sit coms ever made and it has been a delight to work on this material over the summer months with such a talented and enthusiastic cast and production team. The actors have relished playing these iconic characters, but I like to think that they have done more than just impersonate the TV originals. They have made the characters their own and filled them out with their own personalities and skills in a way that I am sure you will appreciate.

The script is loosely based on some of the key episodes from the earlier series of the show and, as you will see, contains many of its most classic moments. While some of the humour from that time may sit a little uneasily with us now, I would like you to receive it in the spirit in which it was originally intended. It is, after all, a period piece now (more than 35 years later!) and can be enjoyed, I hope, as a piece of nostalgia and a testament to a less troubled time. Richard Curtis wrote the original scripts and this piece has many of his hallmark qualities: quirky but loveable characters, witty one-liners, hilarious situations, and, of course, in the form of the burgeoning relationship between Hugo and Alice, a good dollop of romantic comedy. Thrown into the mix the fact that donations from the production will go to support Comic Relief and I hope we will have achieved a formula for a very enjoyable evening. I am sure that the Reverend Geraldine would want to give the cast, crew and production team her Blessing for our five performances this week!

Nick Vause - Director

For many years, Nick worked as the Head of Drama at schools in North London. While there, he directed his students in a variety of theatre productions from Shakespeare and Brecht to Broadway musicals. In his spare time, he's also been a keen amateur actor and has appeared frequently with local theatre companies, including Potters Bar Theatre Company, the Hertfordshire Players and Hampstead Garden Suburb Theatre. Some of his favourite roles have included Charles in Blithe Spirit, CS Lewis in Shadowlands and the Reverend Hale in The Crucible. More



recently he has also directed a number of plays, including *Playhouse Creatures* and *Jumpy* (for PBTC) *The Memory of Water* (for HDOS) and *Rabbit Hole* and *Flare Path* for the Incognito Theatre Company in Barnet. He is delighted to be back at the Wyllyotts Theatre to direct tonight's production of *The Vicar of Dibley*.



Dawn has always loved comedy & grew up watching *The Vicar of Dibley*, so was very excited to get the chance to play one of her favourite characters on TV. Dawn has played a variety of amazing characters over the years in many plays & musicals, which included the chance to learn puppetry in *Avenue Q* & perform a whole show on roller skates as *Buffy* in *Starlight Express*

Dawn hopes she does the late great Emma Chambers proud with her portrayal of Alice Tinker.

Joshua Plaut - Owen Newitt

Josh Plaut is known for his "immersive" method acting. He hasn't shaved, showered, or spoken politely since rehearsals began—an approach that's starting to cause problems at work. Castmates have gently suggested he might be taking things too far, especially after he enrolled in a course on animal husbandry, which he had to abandon when they caught him at it. Josh is no stranger to the stage, having previously strutted about as Captain Alberto Bertorelli 'Allo 'Allo, pickpocketed his way through Oliver! as Fagin, and glared ominously as Annas Jesus Christ Superstar. Typecasting is starting to feel personal. Offstage, Josh enjoys foraging, muttering to himself in barns, and scaring off potential suitors with unsolicited monologues about sewage. While his aroma enters the room before he does, his commitment is undeniable. Josh insists he'll return to normal life after the show though no one's holding their breath, even if they want to.

Gary Colledge - Frank Pickle

Fresh from the manic fun of playing Mal in *The Addams Family*, Gary is looking forward to delivering the comic dialogue of the brilliant Paul Mayhew-Archer and Richard Curtis and is especially excited to be 'taking the minutes' as the character of Frank Pickle in this production. As a character actor some of Gary's favourite roles have been; Motel *Fiddler on the Roof*, Ali Hakim *Oklahoma!*, Litte Kev *Outside Edge*, Will Mossop *Hobson's Choice*, Canon Throbbing *Habeas Corpus*, Mr Snow *Carousel*, Dromio *Comedy of Errors* and Charlie 'Charlie the Duck' Clench *One Man*, *Two Guvnors*. As director, he has produced, both plays and musicals, many diverse titles including; *Abigail's Party, Arms and the Man, Arsenic and Old Lace, Wind in the Willows*, *The Rise and Fall of the Little Voice*, 'Allo 'Allo, Annie, Scrooge, and A Slice of Saturday Night, and is looking forward to directing *The Great British Bake Off Musical* for PBTC, to be presented here at Wyllyotts in November 2026.

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
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
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
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
